



THE POINT

Jesus came to start a movement where people loved God and cared for each other. They shared each others burdens and helped each other move closer and closer to being more like Jesus. God's desire is community, but the enemy's tactic is isolation. You were never meant to do life alone.

LEADER NOTES

In this time together we want to encourage students that meeting together with other believers is an important part of their spiritual walk. God desires community for our lives. Think through the personality of your group. How can we get them more committed, not just to the InFusion group and Fusion, but also to each other. Keep in mind that you do not have to go through all the questions. Find the ones that work best for your group.

GROUP CHALLENGE

When God's people decide to care for each other and form a circle around each other (illustration from Wednesday night) we can guard each other against the enemy and push each other closer to Jesus.

SCRIPTURE

Ecclesiastes 4:9-10

Galatians 6:2

FUSION GROUP QUESTIONS

CHOOSE THE BEST ONES FOR YOUR GROUP

GET GOING: ICEBREAKERS/ACTIVITIES/HANG OUT TIME

(LEADER NOTE: Think through kicking off the night with a game that requires teamwork. Look up minute to win it games that require more than one person or a game that you personally think would be great!)

Tell a story about the funnest / funniest moment you've had with friends.

What's your favorite sport? Does it require teamwork? In what way? Why is teamwork important in that sport? What would happen if there were no other people on the team?

GET TALKING: DISCUSSION/CONVERSATION

When Jesus came to the earth, he didn't do life alone. Jesus had a group of people he called his Disciples. He knew that it took a team to accomplish and carry out the life God desires for all people. Jesus knew that we would need community, so he lived in community to set an example for us. If Jesus made community a priority, then community should be our priority.

GET SPIRITUAL: BIBLE VERSES/SPIRITUAL APPLICATIONS

Read **Ecclesiastes 4:9-12**

What does this passage tell us about being there for each other?

Our Christian walk will be filled with both highs and lows. It's important that we have others in our lives for both. God has a plan for your life, and you were never meant to do it alone.

What are the benefits in community?

What are the barriers (things that would keep you from) community?

LEADER NOTE: Try to get them talking about the things in their life that cause them to pull away from other believers.

GET PRACTICAL: ACTION STEPS

What are some things that we as an InFusion group can do to create more \ community? / What are some ways that you personally can make community with other believers a priority?

Part of being in community with other believers is sharing each other burdens. **(See Galatians 6:2)** Praying specifically for each other is one way of doing that. Break up into groups of 2-3, and take turns praying for each other. Make it a priority to check in on each other later in the week for updates on that persons specific prayer request.
